
















Religious Education





INTENT









We deliver a curriculum (under the guidance of Enfield SACRE) that:

- Celebrates the rich community at Galliard by being open and objective and does not seek to urge religious beliefs on our pupils, nor compromises the integrity of their own religious position by promoting one tradition over another.
- Is inclusive, develops a positive attitude towards other people, respecting their right to hold beliefs that are different to their own
- Encourages our children to be inquisitive about other's beliefs developing inquiry based R.E. skills, asking and reflecting on challenging questions that allow them to be culturally aware of the world around them.
- Promotes the values and attitudes necessary for citizenship in a multi-faith and multi-racial society through developing understanding of, respect for, and dialogue with people of different beliefs, practices, races and cultures.
- Our curriculum embraces the community in which it is situated and Where possible children are taken on visits to places of worship in order to enrich their learning and provide first hand experiences.
- Promotes pupil's spiritual, moral, cultural and social development, equality and understanding of British Values ensuring they are prepared for life in modern Britain.











































IMPLEMENTATION

The R.E. curriculum is led and overseen by Mrs Conway who monitors, evaluates, reviews and celebrates good practice with the support and involvement of the staff at Galliard Primary School.





The teaching of Religious Education makes a distinctive contribution to our school curriculum. The curriculum is based upon the Enfield SACRE scheme of work.



- RE follows a whole school approach and is taught weekly.
- The syllabus covers the 6 main world faiths from Year 1 to 6 and each year group will learn at least 5 of the main faiths.
- RE lessons build upon prior learning and develop skills, knowledge and understanding year upon year.
- Consideration as to when key religious festivals are taught ensures that they are taught during the time of the festival.
- Assessment of RE is in line with the whole school feedback policy, assessing progress and attainment.








IMPACT
